





- Thin card for front and back covers this will need to be cut down to A6 and A5 depending on the size of books chosen to make
- Selection of decorative papers patterned paper, wallpaper, old maps, magazine pages, etc to create collage book covers
- Envelope Cass will demonstrate how to incorporate standard envelopes into the A5 books and make your own within your A6 books
- UHU glue or glue stick
- White or coloured waxed thread this could be embroidery thread you have waxed yourself (with beeswax) or prewaxed thread, this needs to be less than 1mm thick to fit through the needle
- Bookbinding needle or textile needle basically a thin needle with a large eye
- Awl for punching holes in your book
- Ruler
- Pencil
- Optional extras for creating a page divider, fastening and adding finishing touches
 beads, split pins (brads), thin ribbon, buttons, letter stamps and ink pad, decorative paper punch

Machine Embroidered Beautiful Butterfly with Claire Muir

This butterfly is a great way of using up materials and threads that you probably already have in your "stash". The exact materials used in the photo of the butterfly have been listed, but when it comes to colour of thread and size of seguin, have a rummage through your materials and let your creativity begin.

Materials you will need:

- Butterfly Template
- 20 x 20 cm water-soluble fabric: Madeira Avalon Film (or Aquatics Avalon or other brand of thin, soluble film)
- Machine embroidery Thread: Madeira Rayon 40 in colours 1292 and 1291 (you could use polyester or cotton thread)
- Small amount of merino wool tops in teal
- Small piece of fine teal net, lace or other thin fabric
- Small amount of Angelina fibres in Green Pearl
- 20cm x 0.315mm silver wire (4mm and coloured copper wire is fine)
- 1 x silver coloured crimp 1 x 1 mm (or a size 11 seed bead)
- Crystal Bicones: 1 x 6mm Blue Zircon; 6 x 4mm Blue Zircon
- Flat Backed Crystals: 2 x 4mm Blue Zircon; 4 x 4mm Crystal; 6 x 3mm Blue Zircon
- Seguins: 2 x 8mm Silver; 2 x 6mm Teal
- Invisible thread or matching hand-sewing thread

Equipment you will need:

- Free machine embroidery foot, or a free motion guilting foot or darning foot – this does not usually come with the machine, but can be bought separately. If you have a separate guilting kit, there should be one in there.
- Size 80 Universal machine needle
- 15cm wooden embroidery hoop
- Wire cutters
- Flat nosed pliers or crimping pliers
- Hand sewing needles
- Pins E6000 glue
- Toothpicks
- Tweezers
- Milk bottle lid
- Piece of polystyrene (to pin work to and allow to dry)

- Selection of buttons
- Mix of paper/recycled plastic/fabric scraps

Faux Nué - Shading Over Couched Threads with Kate Pankhurst and Kathryn Saunders, Royal School of Needlework (RSN)

Inspired by the beautiful effects created in Or Nué Goldwork, 'Faux Nué' uses DMC/Anchor stranded threads, couched down with different colours to create this charming apple tree. The background rows are stitched in a regular pattern known as 'bricking', while the colour threads are introduced to build up the design. A mesmerising and satisfying technique!

There is no pattern for this Workshop. You will draw freehand a small tree on to your fabric. In the workshop, the Tutor, Kate Pankhurst, will teach you how to complete a few rows by going through the technique thoroughly, and you will finish the piece in your own time.
